She works in various community settings around the city including creating the Maxlife Dance Company at a local youth project. Her professional experience includes working as a dancer at Alton Towers, and performing in various local shows and pantomimes over the years. Elise is currently completing her PGCE, alongside teaching dance and continuing performing in both amateur and professional shows.

#### Nicola

I'm first and foremost a Mum and Wife, and I guess Poet comes next on the list.
I was classically trained in stage dance from the age of five, and competed in the Hull Dance festivals. I went onto study performing Arts at Riley College (Part of Hull College) for three years (1995-1998) My favourite subject was choreography, and I also showed strength in script writing.



In 2009 I began developing teaching strategies to help children who have disabilities and learning difficulties, basic numeracy and phonics. However, I then became ill with a condition called Myalgic Encephalomyelitis/Chronic Fatigue Syndrome (M.E/C.F.S) which left me housebound most days, and unfortunately no longer able to dance. I began using writing poetry as a therapeutic and creative outlet. In 2018, my daughter started studying performing arts, and performed in a Back To Ours show. I then became a Back To Ours Hub Member, and a Member of Chat To Ours. I found volunteering with Chat To Ours, as front of house/chatting with audiences, was something that I could do now and again, on days when my health condition wasn't so bad. Although I performed years ago, I prefer being behind the scenes, or in an audience nowadays.





#### Molly Harman

is an illustrator from Hull who graduated from Cambridge School of Art in 2020. Drawing inspiration from nature, local heritage and folklore, she aims to make work that holds atmosphere, and a sense of narrative.

She hopes her work within The Comfort Chronicles supports the personal but expressive stories, and the unique energy of the show.
